

Instructor Applicants will submit a CV and teaching philosophy & cover letter; recommendation from a Bishop is preferred for applicants other than seminary faculty members.

Synods are encouraged to share their qualified resources as well.

DMin or PhD applicants preferred.



Curriculum

The program offers eight courses with room in the schedule for an independent study designed and facilitated by synods if they so desire.

Each course has eight sessions with two being in real time over zoom and six being presented asynchronously via pre-recorded videos.

Instructors are encouraged to engage with students one on one and provide feedback for written assignments appropriate to the subject matter using the Google platform.

Individual course audits are available.

The academic year runs from September – May with two courses offered every two months.

Enrollment is capped at 40 students (plus auditors) per cycle.



Collection of tuition and auditing fees

Payments to Program Coordinator, Instructors, and Cohort Leaders


Maintaining a balanced budget

- Whatever entry/vetting process as defined by Bishops.
- Possible subsidies for students to help cover tuition.
- Assigning an independent study (if needed).
- A final interview/approval equivalence.
- The "consecration" or "commissioning" that would take place after completion of the program.
- Providing mentorships once the student is serving in a ministry context.
- Decision regarding dispensation.
