

Dear sisters and brothers of the West Virginia- Western Maryland Synod,
Pentecost 2020

Along with you we have watched with sadness and anger the events unfolding around our country in the aftermath of the most recent deaths of African American men at the hands of both police and armed civilians in Minneapolis and Georgia respectively. We write to affirm our commitments as the baptized people of God in this place we call home that racism has no place in our congregations or communities in which we live. Our baptismal calling demands love of neighbor even as the Commandments require that we help and protect our neighbor. What we have witnessed in the last several weeks lays bare, yet again, a brokenness that is of the deepest kind.

We call upon one another to pray:

For justice to be done through the legal channels for Ahmaud Aubrey and George Floyd.

For the peace of Christ to surround their families during this very public time of grief.

For the safety of law enforcement – local and state police, national guard and emergency providers – during these times of public unrest.

For local community leaders who are trying to lead peaceful protest that their voices would be heard above those who would harm their neighbors and destroy their livelihoods.

For our congregations in Minneapolis, Atlanta and other urban centers in the midst of unrest that their witness of presence provides a sign of hope and vision amid these challenging days.

We challenge one another to act:

We are the Body of Christ in these mountains and hills. We condemn any type of white supremacy in our communities. We must all be leaders in our communities to foster dialogue, encourage understanding, stand in the “gap” when necessary as people of peace who are still people of justice. It is a tall order in these times of divisive rhetoric but it is what makes us distinct as people of the crucified and risen Lord. While each context of our congregations is unique there is work to be done in our cities, towns and rural areas to continue to work actively against racism in its blatant and more subtle forms. We, as your pastors, make these commitments and pray that you will have already begun this work.
